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
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Rewriting History

There's an old saying, "those who forget the past are doomed to repeat it". And, while it may not apply fully to your management of the Matrix database, there is a reason you would want to use the information it gathers over time.

But, there comes a time when the information regarding the number of inserts John Smith used on that job four years ago loses much of its value. Your faithful Matrix continues to collect and store this information with as much dedication as the crazy cat lady next door collects head shots of Morris. The point is, you more than likely do not need nine live's of information – so what now? In old versions of Matrix software, you would be deleting each entry, line by line. And, while this may not seem like much, I invite you to take a look at your transaction history for one month... Consider deleting the records one by one for a moment and you'll soon find yourself boarding the slow train to insanity...

Thankfully, this journey through the nine rings of hell need not be taken. Matrix TM was released with an insightful addition – the ability to selectively delete certain information from the database. While ver. 4.7 will allow you to delete records entered before your target date, ver. 5.2 allows a few more options, including selecting records "from" and "to" specific dates. This operation is not reversible, so be warned – back up your database.



Once you hit execute, there is no going back, so be absolutely sure you want to delete the records – there is nothing worse than a getting a request from upstairs for a report spanning the last year (or two) just after you have deleted that information.

Problem 1: With a fast-growing number of tools in Company A's tool crib, efficient management of the tools became impossible. Tools were regularly lost or misplaced, employee time was wasted.

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Aww sCrap!

Well, it's not exactly a four letter word, but it's not one that people like to hear – when talking about material, anyway.

Like it or not though, if you are getting tooling reground and having the Matrix control it, it's going to become "a part of the biz". If reground tooling is set up to be returned to the Matrix after use, at some point the item is going to be ready for the...scrap heap — hopefully, not too much of a heap though. Come to think of it, you'll be using this function if you are setting up any returnable (durable) tooling — if you want to accurately track when its life ended.

To do this, it starts with the operator taping the "RETURN" icon after logging in. The next step is to select the item that is going to be scrapped. Enter the number of items that are being scrapped and tap the "SCRAP" button at the bottom, beside the "RETURN" button. A new window will open, prompting the user to enter a reason for the scrap. Reasons can be selected from a drop-down menu – but these must be created by an admin user beforehand. Once the scrap transaction has been completed, the operator just has to hit the exit icon and the login screen will appear.



More recent versions of the Matrix-TM software allow users to enter remarks, typed either from a virtual keyboard or a physical one, instead of relying on the generic reasons that might be created by the tooling manager/admin user

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Who's your huckleberry?

I don't ever recall hearing or seeing this term anywhere – except in Tombstone (Val Kilmer). Needless to say, it was a stretch to use it here, but I guess your suppliers could be considered your huckleberries... but you can call them whatever you like...

Adding new items to your Matrix involves collecting and entering a fair amount of data. You may want to add supplier information to the mix, especially if you are planning on using the auto-order function. It will also help you filter through your list of tooling as it grows. You can access the supplier list by clicking on Main -> Supplier. From here, click the "add" icon and a new window will open, allowing you to add the contact information for your huckleberry...uh, supplier.

Important to note here is the field designated for an email address. This is the address the Matrix will use when sending (draft) POs. Not entering the information here will require you to manually enter that info each time a PO is created. Many customers request orders be sent to various people in the organization, which is possible – but multiple email addresses need to be separated by a comma (as opposed to a coma...). There will be at least one other piece of information that must be filled in before the Matrix will allow you to save the record. You will see an "Order Parameters" tab in the Supplier Maintenance window. Once on this screen, you can set a schedule for the auto-order to run for each specific supplier – this can be set based on how much/how often you require tooling from them. You can also set this to "do not run", but you will still be required to select a shipping method from the drop-down menu before saving the record.

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
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
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
